

March in and Volunteer for the National March for Life!

This Friday, January 18th, the 2019 March for Life will be held just down the road in Washington, D.C. As Catholics and Knights of Columbus, we are called to defend life in all its stages, especially the lives of the most vulnerable among us. And who among us is more vulnerable than the unborn child?

Again this year, the Knights of Columbus will be a major sponsor and driving force behind the March for Life and its related activities, including the Youth Rally and Mass for Life at the Capital One Arena, the Rose Dinner, and multiple pro-life Masses Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Tens of thousands of marchers will be carrying the famous green and white Knights of Columbus "Defend Life" signs as they march from the National Mall to the Supreme Court.

If you are able, you are highly encouraged to participate in

the March and related activities as your time permits. Below, you will find details of where and when to gather to participate in the March with your Brother Knights from the Maryland State Council, as well as the details for opportunities to serve as volunteer marshals for the Youth Mass for Life, and as an usher for one or more of the Masses at the Basilica.

If you cannot make it to the National March for Life this weekend, then please mark your calendars now for the annual Maryland March for Life in Annapolis on Monday, March 4th, 2019. More details will follow, but the Council will organize a carpool to the Maryland March for Life, where we will rally to support legislation such as the pain capable unborn child protection act, and voice our opposition to harmful legislation such as a bill to legalize physician assisted suicide.

Happy New Year, Brother Knights, Family, and Friends! I hope everyone had a joyous Christmas season and that you were able to spend some quality time with family and friends. As we pass the halfway point in this Fraternal Year, I wanted to check in with you on of the goals we set as a Council back in July.

I am pleased to report we are on track to again meet and exceed the re-

quirements to earn the Columbian Award for programming excellence in our activity areas of Faith, Family, Community, and Life. This year, we are required to earn 16 program "credits," including one required program in each of the four areas. As of this writing, we are on track for all required programs, and for a total of at least 20 program credits. This is a testament to our collective commitment as Brother Knights of Patuxent Council to being a force for

good in support of our Parish and the Laurel community.

In other areas, we've been published this year in Columbia magazine's "Knights in Action" online. We've also expanded on a Coats for Kids partnership with the Laurel Police Department, distributing a total of 72 new winter coats. Meeting times have been held to about an hour or less.

However, one area where we are lagging is in recruiting new members. Through 6+ months, we have only added 4 new members to our Council this year. In order to continue as a force for good, we must continue to bring "baby Brothers" into our Council. As I urged last month, please talk to your fellow parishioners about the Knights and help spread the word about our multitude of good works. Talk up our forthcoming programs which are specifically spiritual in nature (the Marian Icon Prayer Service, a Men's Retreat, our Rosary Program, etc.). Remember, together as Knights we provide charitable service to others while living and growing deeper in our Catholic faith. It's something we should all be a part of.

Financial Secretary's Corner

Ever wonder how your \$38 dues is spent? Imagine the Council taking in \$6,600 in dues. "Known overhead" of \$3,300 accounts for exactly half this total: \$1,800 State per capita and \$700 Supreme per capita, about \$700 for Catholic advertising and Culture of Life and \$100 for Grand Knight Chapter dues. That leaves \$3,300 for supplies from both Supreme as well as office expenses (computer ink and paper does add up), about \$500 for liability insurance, website maintenance and other fees and materials. These amounts are relatively stable.

There is one more expense that fluctuates, and it is one that you personally can control: postage. At \$.50 per letter, each member is sent both their first notice dues bill and then their membership card. Second and third notices add up accordingly. Members in arrears get additional letters. You can help cut these costs! Pay your dues at a meeting or upon receipt, of course. Those who no longer want to remain in the Order need only send the notice back with a signed statement saying "I no longer wish to be a Knights of Columbus member" and that is that.


